



HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

Holy week begins with Palm Sunday, when we commemorate Jesus' joyous procession into Jerusalem. Jesus comes as a leader. However, his crown is a Crown of Thorns and his throne is the Cross. During Holy Week we reflect on the events leading to our redemption: the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders by which a new covenant is made between God and man; Jesus' redeeming Passion and Death and His Resurrection which is our promise of eternal life.

We invite all Parishioners to experience these most solemn events of our Christian Faith.

(the Blessing of palms will take place in the vestibule followed by the procession into the sanctuary)

April 13th

HOLY THURSDAY

7 p.m. Holy Mass

(Commemoration of the Lord's Last Supper: the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. The washing of the feet is a reminder that the priest is called to minister to his community).

April 14th

GOOD FRIDAY

2:45 p.m. Musical reflections

3 p.m. Celebration of the Passion of our Lord

(This is a liturgy of Word and Service. We gather to reflect on the Passion and our salvation.)

April 15th

HOLY SATURDAY

Solemn vigil at Jesus' tomb

8:00 p.m. Blessing of the fire and preparation of the Candle

Easter Vigil Liturgy of the Word and Holy Mass of the Resurrection

(In this evening's liturgy, we welcome Christ as our Light, reflect on our salvation history, renew our Baptismal vows, and celebrate Christ's glorious Resurrection.)
