



## **HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE**

Holy week begins with Palm Sunday, when we commemorate Jesus' joyous procession into Jerusalem. Jesus comes as a leader. However, his crown is a Crown of Thorns and his throne is the Cross.

During Holy Week we reflect on the events leading to our redemption: the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders by which a new covenant is made between God and man; Jesus' redeeming Passion and Death and His Resurrection which is our promise of eternal life.

We invite all Parishioners to experience these most solemn events of our Christian Faith.

*(Commemoration of the Lord's Last Supper: the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders. The washing of the feet is a reminder that the priest is called to minister to his community).*

### **GOOD FRIDAY**

**2:45 p.m. Musical reflections;**

**3 p.m. Celebration of the Passion of our Lord.**

*(This is a liturgy of Word and Service. We gather to reflect on the Passion and our salvation.)*

**Solemn vigil at Jesus' tomb.**

**March 26th**

### **HOLY SATURDAY**

**Solemn vigil at Jesus' tomb.**

**8:00 p.m. Blessing of the fire and preparation of the Candle;**

**Easter Vigil Liturgy of the Word and Holy Mass of the Resurrection.**

*(In this evening's liturgy, we welcome Christ as our Light, reflect on our salvation history, renew our Baptismal vows, and celebrate Christ's glorious Resurrection.)*
